Dear Golf, Sports Turf, and Landscape Professionals:

The 2025 Kentucky Turf and Landscape Management Short Course will be held in-person at the Hardin County Extension Center, in Elizabethtown, KY, on **Wednesday and Thursday, February 19-20, 2025**. You may pre-register by mail or online (https://kentuckyhorticulturecouncil.ticketspice.com/2025-ky-turf-landscape-management-short-course).

The event will begin on Tuesday, February 18 with a pre-conference pesticide certification training to prepare attendees to take the Kentucky Pesticide Applicator's Exam. If taking the exam, be sure to go online and study the Core Manual and category specific material. These study materials can be found here through the University of Kentucky Department of Entomology. If you need a printed version of the study material, contact your local County Extension Office – if you aren't sure where that is, consult the state map.

The initial certification exam will be given immediately after the training on Tuesday, February 18, at approximately 3:15 pm. You must also <u>register with the Kentucky Department of Agriculture</u> and can now pay online for the exam before the Short Course. Follow the link and register as an applicator if you have not already or login. Then select "Register for a Written Test" and select 2/18/25-Elizabethtown-Turf and Landscape Short Course Only for location. Then select the test Category. For Turf, Lawn and Ornamental, select one of the following: A3 for Applicator, O3 for Operator or N3 for non-commercial. You may prepay the \$25 exam fee online or click the box to bring a check/money order to the exam site.

Short Course sessions include Golf, Sports Turf, and Lawn & Landscape. We have many professionals on the program as well as a number of excellent out-of-state speakers this year and our trade show will feature approximately 20 exhibitors.

Six CEUs have been approved for each day with category specific points available in **Category 3** on both Feb. 19 & 20, **Category 11 (Aerial) on Feb**. 19 in Lawn and Golf tracks, and **Category 10 (Demonstration and Research) on Feb. 20** in Lawn and Golf tracks. CEUs will be requested from KY, IN, OH, and TN departments of agriculture as well as Golf Course Superintendents Association of America (GCSAA) and Professional Grounds Management Society (PGMS).

A Trading Post bulletin board will be available to sell used equipment, so bring along any descriptions containing your name, phone number, and the equipment price for posting.

Note that registration does not include lunch. There are several local options for quick service. Please make any room reservations directly with local hotels. Options include several national chains in close proximity. Visit the Elizabethtown Tourism & Convention Bureau website (https://www.touretown.com/) to learn more about the local area.

NOTE: we strongly urge you to pre-register before Friday, February 14, as on-site registration will be \$85 per day and space may not be available.

The Short Course event will be held regardless of weather conditions. Due to the cost to host and administrative requirements of this event, we cannot issue refunds. We will, however, accept company substitutions.

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
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
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
